The Archer Avenue at the Belt Railway Company of Chicago Grade Separation Study, an initiative of the CREATE Program, brings together vital local, state, and federal partnerships to create a safer and more efficient transportation system designed to improve the quality of life for residents and visitors of the Archer Heights and Garfield Ridge community areas. The project will eliminate the "grade crossing", where the railroad and Archer Avenue intersect at the same level, and create an overpass or underpass to improve travel.
